A rising percentage of our credential holders is international, as a larger global audience sees the possibilities safety certification holds for individual careers and workplace safety.

In 2024, we experienced continued advancement in India, the Middle East, and Africa (IMEA). The year also marked a milestone with BCSP's first Board President from the IMEA region. Additionally, we saw worldwide expansion of our volunteer network of BCSP Ambassadors, who contributed significantly to our growth through mentoring and outreach.





The Global Learning Summit (GLS) returned in May 2024 to provide EHS professionals access to virtual professional development sessions, featuring high-quality content from industry experts. Attendees also gained opportunities for networking and recertification points—all for just \$25. In 2024, 4,475 people registered for GLS, and the event hosted 108 speakers and 118 sessions.



Launched May 31, 2024, Mentor Connect provides a space for safety professionals to connect and learn from one another. The online platform offers prospective mentors guidance on best practices; includes user profiles and a dashboard focused on fostering connection; and provides an easy-to-use calendar to plan virtual or in-person meetings.



Launched April 2024, examCORE\* Live Online combines the convenience of BCSP's examCORE Online option with the face-to-face value of examCORE In-Person. This innovative format expands access to BCSP exam preparation, allowing candidates to connect with expert instructors and peers in real time from anywhere in the world.

In 2024, BCSP redesigned its website, BCSP.ORG, enhancing both user experience and functionality. The new site features a more intuitive navigation system, faster load times, and a mobile-friendly layout, making it easier for visitors to quickly find the resources they need. This updated version incorporates a streamlined design that better reflects our brand's evolution.
